PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Public Rearing on Local Law #1 of the year 1975

The Clerk read the notice calling for a public hearing on Local Law #1 of the year 1975.

The Chairman declared the public hearing open for anyone wishing to be heard.

Supervisor McNeil asked if the salaries can be changed later. The County Attorney said it is subject to permissive referendum but the salaries can be reduced at a later date. To be increased there would have to be another local law.

Mr. Craine moved, seconded by Mr. Angell, that the Public Hearing be closed, *since* there was no one wishing to be heard. Carried.

The County Officers and Civil Service Committee offered the following Local Law for enactment.

STATE OF NEW YORK
COUNTY OF CHENANGO
LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 1975

A LOCAL LAW fixing the annual salaries of certain County Officers.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Chenango.

Section 1—The flat annual salaries of the following named County Officers shall be the amount set opposite each, to wit:

County Highway Superintendent	\$16,130.00
County Treasurer	14,435.00
Commissioners of Elections	8,515.00
Commissioner of Social Services	20,500.00
Director Real Property Tax Services	17,000.00

Section 2—The above specified shall be effective on and after January second, nineteen hundred and seventy six.

Section 3—This law shall be subject to a permissive referendum as provided in Section twenty four of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York, but no petition for a referendum be filed, then this law shall become effective upon filing same with the Department of State and State Comptroller's Office.

Mr. Angell moved, seconded by Mr. Craine, that the Local Law #1 of 1975 be adopted. Carried.
